- > Students with 100% attendance will be awarded with cash prize on College Day.
- > Students who are not able to attend the college due to their medical condition, should produce a valid medical certificate immediately after they rejoin the class.
- ➤ If a Students is absent for 10 continuous days his/her name will be removed from the attendance register.
- > Taking leave without prior information and coming late to the classes will be reported to the HOD & Principal.

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

- > Students must wear their College Identity Card inside the campus, if not they will not be allowed to the classes..
- ➤ Loitering in the campus during class hours is strictly prohibited.
- ➤ No students should leave the college campus during college hours without gate pass signed by the HOD and PRINCIPAL
- > Students should observe the safety measures of the laboratories and should also maintain cleanliness in the lab.
- > Students are expected to perform well in their Internal Assessment Tests and complete the assignments given in each subject during the semester.
- The college maintains absolute discipline and any student violating the rules of college is liable to severe punishments which includes dismissal from the college.
- > Students dismissed due to nondisciplinary actions will not be entitled to receive any certificates or refund of fee and deposits.
- Any student found responsible for any damage to the college building, furniture or equipment will be punished severely and the cost of damage will be recovered along with the fine amount. The college reserves the right to expel such students.
- > Students are strictly forbidden from organizing or attending any unauthorized meetings in the college campus or collecting money for any purpose without the prior written permission from the Principal.

- Mass absenteeism in the classes and instigating fellow students to take leave themselves or to go on strike are serious violations of discipline and may result in expulsion from the college.
- > Students are strictly not allowed to form any unions or associations under the banner of any political parties, caste, colour, language, nationality or political ideology within the campus.
- > The code of conduct of the students must be in appropriate manner at all times so as to bring credit to themselves and to the college.
- > Students should maintain peace and decorum in the campus.
- > Students are expected to be punctual and must be present in the class by 9.00 a.m.
- Power bikes and motorcycles equipped with fancy horns are prohibited in the campus.
- > The vehicles should be parked only in the space allotted in the campus by the college administration.
- Modest dress code must be followed regularly:

Girls: Sarees, Churidhars & Pants / Jeans with Shirts /T-Shirts without any writings.

Boys: Pants/Jeans with shirts/T-shirts with collar and without any writings.

- > Smoking, consumption of alcohol, drugs etc. are strictly prohibited and severe disciplinary action will be taken against delinquents.
- > Students must avoid bringing costly items to the college. If lost management is not responsible.
- > The college gates will be closed during the break hours. Students cannot go out during the intervals.
- > Students are allowed to bring home food for their own lunch.
- > Stone benches are built in various places in our college for students convenience. They can utilize those bench only for studying, to eat lunch and using laptops etc.,

CHANGE OF RESIDENCE

The students should report to the college office whenever he/she shifts their residence. Failure to report within three days will be considered as a serious breach of discipline.

BANNING OF MOBILE PHONES

- ➤ Use of mobile phones, i-pods etc. are not permitted in the campus.
- > Severe action will be taken against those students who are found using mobile phones inside the campus, which includes confiscation of the device.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE / DISCIPLINARY ACTION COMMITTEE

- ➤ The college has constituted an Anti Ragging Committee (ARC) comprising of Principal / Vice-Principal / Student Representatives / Senior Faculty / Foreign Student Advisor.
- ➤ The college has also a Disciplinary Action Committee (DAC) comprising of Vice-Principal, Deans and HODs of all departments, who assist to maintain discipline.
- ➤ ARC / DAC functions to oversee and maintain discipline on campus, in the buses and in the hostel premises.

Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997

Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997 prohibits ragging in any form within or outside the educational institution. Ragging and any form of abutment to ragging, causing injury or subjecting to forceful confinement, physical and sexual assault and eve-teasing would be treated as a criminal offence.

What is Ragging?

Ragging means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear, shame or embarrassment to a student in any institution. It also includes teasing, abusing, playing practical jokes, or hurting student.

Penalty for Ragging

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates "ragging" inside or outside any educational institution shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend upto two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs.20,000/-

Dismissal of Student

Any student who is convicted under any IPC Section, will be dismissed from the educational institution and those student will not be admitted in any other educational institution.

Suspension of Student

- ➤ Without prejudice to the forgoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head or the Management. This issue will be inquired immediately. If found true, they shall suspend the guilty without prejudice.
- > The decision of the Management will be final, if any student indulged in ragging under IPC Section.
- ➤ The concerned student will be given liberty to give explanation about the incident and if it is found unsatisfactory, the Management will dismiss him/her from the institution.

Library

The library of Hindustan College of Arts & Science is a valued partner in learning, teaching and research for the college. It is also an Institutional Member of the British Council Library, American Consulate Library, Chennai and Inflibnet.

The college library consists of more than 21,168 core books, a large number of journals and magazines, periodicals and 10 newspapers. The library provides access to online resources and wide range of databases to enhance the research knowledge of faculties and students.

Library working hours

The library is open on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 3:30p.m. (Monday to Friday) and 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. (Saturdays).

Conditions to issue Books

ID cards with Barcode should be used to borrow books from the Library.

Medical Checkup

Every year Medical Checkup will be done for Staffs and Students through Smart Vision Hospital.

Renewal of Books

Books will be issued for a maximum period of two weeks. Books must be renewed to extend the period.

Loss of Books

The readers will be responsible for any damage in the borrowed books. If the Reader loss the book and he / she is not able to replace it, he/she has to pay twice the price of the book. Replacement of books should be done within seven days from the date of intimation, failing to do so, a nominal fine will be levied. The same procedure will be followed for the loss of library tickets.

No Dues

To get "No Dues" certificate at the end of the course, the student should return all the library books.

Campus Facilities

- ➤ Bus facility is offered by the college throughout the city.
- A departmental store is available in the campus where students can purchase toiletries, snacks, medicines, souvenirs and other materials. It is open from 9.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m.
- A branch of Indian Overseas Bank is available in the campus.
- A modern guest house is available in the campus for parents/guests to visit the college. A/C and Non A/C rooms are also available at a nominal rent. Reservations can be made with the Principal(atleast 5 days in advance).

Bank Timings

Monday to Friday - 10.00 a.m. -- 4.00 p.m. Saturday (First & Third Saturday only)

Hostels

There are two hostels in HCAS campus with A/C and non A/C rooms. They are

- Philip Hostel for men
- o Malala Hostel for women.

Canteens

The college is running three well maintained and hygienic canteens in the campus for students welfare. Canteens provide tiffin items, meals, fast foods, both vegetarian and non-vegetarian foods, bakery items, ice-creams and soft drinks with nominal price. So the students can utilize the canteens and avoid going out during the break hours.

The common lunch timing is 12:00 pm to 1pm

COLLEGE ACTIVITIES

College Alumni

The Alumni Meet usually happens once a year in the college campus. It is a Reminiscence for the Alumni. An Alumni Facebook page, *REHASH*, was created in which all the important events are displayed and the alumni can register themselves to know the happenings of the college. Leading Alumni are invited as Chief Guests for the event and games are conducted for the alumni to make the show lively. To add more glitz to the event, a tree planting ceremony was done by the Chief Guest last year. Recently, two alumni who have opened an online magazine for sports which gave an opportunity to the present sports students to demonstrate their sports talents through the magazine. In this way, the alumni made to do their contribution to motivate the students of their Alma Mater.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The motto of NCC is unity and discipline. It has been initiated by the Government of India and it includes three forces: Army, Navy, and Airforce.

The NCC Army wing was started in our college in the academic year 2016-2017 and it offers 18 parades per year (4 hours training/1 parade). A 10 day training camp was organized for the benefit of second and third year students. The introduction of NCC is a notable achievement of the college.

National Service Scheme (NSS) / Youth Red Cross (YRC)

The University of Madras has allotted two NSS Units and YRC unit to our college with over 200 students as their members. Every year many activities are conducted.

The Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

The Red Ribbon Club was inaugurated during the year 2006-2007 and the college has been nominated as Nodal Centre for Kancheepuram District to co-ordinate the activities.

Rotaract

The Rotaract Club was established in our college on 5th August, 2017 and is sponsored by Rotary Club of Chennai Capital RID – 3232. It aims at providing an opportunity for students to exchange ideas with leaders in the community, to develop the knowledge and skills that will assist them in personal development, to address the physical and social needs of their communities, to innovative solutions to the world's most pressing challenges and to promote better relations between all people worldwide.

Citizen Consumer Club

The Citizen Consumer Club of our college was established for creating awareness about the consumer rights amongst all consumer segments and to help consumers get

justice when affected. The club aims at to educate the students about the rights of the consumers as provided in the Consumer Protection Act, 1986,

- to mobilize youngsters by instilling in them the spirit of protection of consumer rights
- to impart knowledge about the role of the consumers in protection of their rights
- to strengthen the consumer movement in the country.

Sports Activities

A healthy body also leads to a sound mind. Realizing the need of physical education along with the strenuous academics, the college facilitates the students for various indoor games like Chess, Carom and Badminton. The college also promotes the outdoor games like Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball, Football, Throw Ball, Athletics and Kabaddi.

HCAS Christian Fellowship - Campus Ministry

The college conducts a short service of worship every morning at 9.00 a.m. and a special worship service on the first working day of every month from 9.00 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. It comprises of devotional - hymns, Bible reading, short messages and prayers, into which all are welcome.

Cultural Activities

Every academic year, the college conducts inter-house, inter-collegiate cultural competitions/programs. HINDOTSAV, an inter-collegiate cultural programme is conducted on a large scale once a year.

Four Houses

In order to bring out the students' latent talent, the students are divided into four houses namely Phoenix, Orion, Pegasus and Hercules. The annual inter-house cultural and sports competitions are conducted among the students of four houses. Faculties lead and motivate their assigned house students along with student Captain and Vice-Captain. There are 2 rolling trophies, certificates and other prizes for the competitions.

Parents-Teachers' Meet

Once in a semester, the college provides an opportunity for the parents of the students to interact with the faculties regarding their children's attendance, progress of study and character, in the Parent Teacher Meeting.

Valedictory Function

A valedictory function is held for the outgoing students of the college annually. It includes thanks giving service and planting a sapling in the college campus.

Founder's Day

The college commemorates the birth and death anniversaries of its founder Dr. K.C.G. Verghese on 20th June and 14th February, every year as Founder's Day and Founder's Remembrance Day respectively.

Days of Celebration in the College

Republic Day, Independence Day, International Students' Day, International Yoga Day, Hostel Day, Sports Day, NSS Day, Red Ribbon Day, Women's Day, Teachers' Day and College Day are celebrated in the college with relevant programme content. Prize distribution for meritorious students and staff will be held on College Day.

Educational Tours

The college arranges educational tours for academic purpose. Students are expected to participate and the expenditure towards such tours should be borne by the students. One or more faculty members will accompany the students during such tours. Prior permission from the Principal & Government is mandatory for the tours, the same should be availed atleast 45 days in advance.

Scholarship Details

- ➤ The college will take initiative to get the Government SC/ST scholarships and education loans for the students from the Ministry of Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department of Tamil Nadu Government.
- The students must get concurrence from the Principal in the prescribed application form to get education loans or scholarships from other associations.
- ➤ Education Loans through Bank

Vidyalakshmi Education Loan portal is an initiative by the Government of India. In this portal, students can register with required documents and select one of the banks given, like Indian Overseas Bank, preferably Padur Branch, to apply other education loans through bank.

Zenda Education Loan

Zenda is a private organization where the students can access 'Zero Cost Loan' with 0% Interest, Easy Monthly Instalment & Easy Process to pay their tuition fee and other fee through this loan scheme. This loan process doesn't require any collateral security and it has easy EMI plans to repay it.
